## What Works

- **wr.fi/u** — fully accessible to AI fetchers (no 403)
- **wr.fi/api/p** — write API works fine
- **wr.fi/api/artifacts/\*** — artifact fetch works fine

## What Doesn't Work

- **wr.fi/n8sn** (and all creation pages) — 403 from Cloudflare

### Root cause:

Anthropic's web\_fetch proxy performs TLS inspection, issuing its own certificate (issuer: *Anthropic sandbox-egress-production TLS Inspection CA*). Cloudflare detects the non-browser TLS fingerprint at the connection level — before WAF rules or Workers can intercept it.

## Things Tried

### Disabled Bot Fight Mode

Result: No effect — block happens at a deeper layer

### WAF custom rule: skip all rules for non-POST

Result: No effect — WAF runs after TLS fingerprint check

### Cloudflare Worker to rewrite headers

Result: Worker runs after TLS check — too late

### Disabled Cloudflare proxy (grey cloud)

Result: Origin TLS cert breaks Anthropic proxy verification

### Security Level: Essentially Off

Result: UI removed — option no longer available

## The Fix: Content Negotiation

Same canonical short URL serves both humans and AI models via HTTP content negotiation:

```
GET https://wr.fi/n8sn
Accept: text/html           → renders the page (browser)
Accept: application/json    → returns structured JSON (AI)
```

### JSON response shape:

### Next.js implementation:

```
// app/p/[shortId]/route.ts

    return NextResponse.json(creation);
  }
  // fall through to page render
}
```

### Why This Fits Wrify's Philosophy

- Short URL stays canonical — **wr.fi/n8sn** works for everyone
- No separate `/api/r/` path to document or maintain
- The existing **text/wrify-instructions** script tag already signals AI-readability
- Content negotiation is the natural HTTP-native extension of that pattern
- JSON responses likely bypass Cloudflare bot detection (API-shaped traffic)
- `wr.fi/api/p` (writes) can still be rate-limited independently
